Level 3 (Previously 2c)

- Everything at 2
- 10 Further Experiences
- 1 Positive Report
- Evidence of mentoring & Self-reflection

Level 2 (Previously 2b)

- Everything at 1
- 6 Further experiences
- Completion of L2 Questions
- Evidence of self-reflection

Level 1 (Previously 2a)

- Course Attendance
- 4 Competition Experiences
- Health and Safety Course
- Police Records Disclosure

Assistant Official

- Course attendance
- 2 Competition Experiences
- Police Records Disclosure (16+) or Self-disclosure (U16)

Entry route at Assistant Official or Level 1

Assistant Official is not a pre-requisite for level 1

Assistant Officials

Register

- Register for an Assistant Official's Course (must be over 14 years of age)

Attend

- Attend an Assistant Official's Course – this is a basic multi-disciplinary introductory course to the key areas of officiating.

Collect

- Collect competition experiences under the supervision of a qualified level 1 or above official.

Submit

- Submit an application for accreditation

Assistant Officials – Post Course Applying for Accreditation

Assistant Official

- 14 Years of age
- A minimum of 2 competition experiences detailed on Record of Experience Form
- Police Records Disclosure (16+) or Self-Disclosure (U16)

Level 1

Register

- Register for a level 1 course (must be over 14 years of age)

Attend

- Attend a Level 1 course in chosen discipline (Field, Track, Photofinish, Starter/Starters Assistant, Timekeeping)
- Attend a Health and Safety Course (most health and safety courses are included within the level 1 course)

Collect

- Collect a minimum of 4 Competition Experiences under the supervision of a qualified official (some disciplines may need more than the 4 experiences to cover off a variety of roles)

Submit

- Submit an application for accreditation (must be a minimum of 16 years of age)

Level 1 – Post Course Applying for Accreditation

Level 1

- 16 Years of age
- A minimum of 4 Competition Experiences detailed on Record of Experience Form
- Attendance at Health and Safety Course
- Police Records Disclosure

Level 2

Complete

- Complete the level 2 questions on the course CD

Collect

- Collect a minimum of a further 6 Competition Experiences

Submit

- Submit an application for accreditation (must be a minimum of 16 years of age)

Level 2 – Post Course Applying for Accreditation

Level 2

- Everything at Level 1
- A minimum of a further 6 competition experiences detailed on Record of Experience Form
- Completion of the logbook questions
- Evidence of self-reflection

Level 3

Collect

- Collect a minimum of another 10 Competition Experiences

Report

- Have a report undertaken by an official at level 4 or above

Submit

- Submit an application for accreditation (must be a minimum of 16 years of age)

Level 3 – Post Course Applying for Accreditation

Level 3

- Everything at Level 2
- A minimum of a further 10 competition experiences detailed on the Record of Experience Form
- A positive report
- Evidence of mentoring and self-reflection

Level 4

Register

- Register for a Level 4 Officials Course

Attend

- Attend a Level 4 course in chosen discipline

Collect

- Collect competition experiences, collect 6 specific reports

Submit

- Submit level 4 questions for marking. Submit application for accreditation to level 4

Level 4 – Post Course

Applying for Accreditation

Level 4

- A minimum of 30 Competition Experiences detailed on Record of Experience Form (within 2 years or 3 years for Photofinish)
- 6 specific positive reports
- Completion of Level 4 questions
- Evidence of self-reflection and mentoring
- Continued Police Records Disclosure
