Scottish Athletics is committed to making our sport accessible to all. This will be accomplished by upholding the principles of equality in all aspects of our work. This work is being carried out as part of our responsibilities under the Equality Act 2010 and as part of our continual internal assessment of the Moving to Inclusion Programme - an initiative by all the UK Sports Councils which replaces the previous Equality Standard for Sport Framework.

Analysis and results of the collected EDI data will be anonymised for strategic planning to improve policy, decision-making, and delivery of Scottish Athletics business strategy; identify areas of underrepresentation and seek new approaches for improvements and best practice. Results and insights of this data may be shared anonymously with partners and stakeholders.
